विकास के चरण

हंसराज कॉलेज विकास निधि समिति ने शैक्षणिक वर्ष 2025-2026 के दौरान संस्थान के बुनियादी ढांचे के निरंतर संवर्द्धन में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई। अग्निशामक यंत्रों के नियमित रखरखाव और पुनःभरण की सिफारिश की गई और उचित पर्यवेक्षण के तहत इसे पूरा किया गया। ए ब्लॉक के कमरों में सीसीटीवी कैमरे लगाने की सिफारिश की गई और इसे पूरा किया गया। आरओ प्लांट की सर्विस और मरम्मत, नए ग्रीन हाउस और पॉली हाउस का निर्माण, सीसीटीवी कैमरों का स्थानांतरण, सुरक्षा सेवाओं के लिए निविदा विस्तार, बी ब्लॉक की छत का जलरोधीकरण, स्वच्छता, जल और जल निकासी के लिए नियमित मरम्मत और नवीनीकरण कार्य, वार्षिक दर अनुबंध विस्तार, हाउसकीपिंग सेवाओं के अनुबंध का विस्तार पूरे शैक्षणिक वर्ष के दौरान किया गया। कॉलेज छात्रों के प्रवेश द्वार पर 'पूर्ण ऊंचाई वाला दोहरी लेन वाला टर्नस्टाइल' स्थापित करने की प्रक्रिया को संपादित करते हुए कार्य आदेश जारी कर दिया गया है। पूरे वर्ष समिति के सभी सदस्य कॉलेज के विकास के लिए प्रतिबद्धता और समर्पण के साथ कार्य करते रहे।

शिक्षा सम्बन्धी उपलब्धियाँ

विशिष्ट छात्र

खेल-कूद संबंधी

खेल-कूद के क्षेत्र में अंतरराष्ट्रीय एवं राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर हंसराज कॉलेज का प्रदर्शन सर्वदा सराहनीय रहा है। हमारे यहाँ अंतरराष्ट्रीय स्तर की शूटिंग रेंज के साथ-साथ अंतरराष्ट्रीय मानकों के आधार पर निर्मित बैडमिंटन कोर्ट भी उपलब्ध है। इस वर्ष भी हमारे विद्यार्थियों ने अंतरराष्ट्रीय, राष्ट्रीय एवं विश्वविद्यालय स्तर की विविध स्पर्धाओं में अनेकानेक पुरस्कार एवं पदक जीत कर कॉलेज का नाम रौशन किया है।

हंसराज कॉलेज में शारीरिक शिक्षा और खेल विज्ञान विभाग अपने खेल से सम्बंधित व्यापक बुनियादी ढांचे, तीरंदाजी और अंतरराष्ट्रीय मानक शूटिंग रेंज, बास्केटबॉल कोर्ट, फुटबॉल ग्राउंड, इनडोर बैडमिंटन कोर्ट, शतरंज की सुविधा, क्रिकेट ग्राउंड, पूर्ण सुसज्जित जिम और योग, ध्यान एवं फिजियोथेरेपी के लिए समर्पित स्थान की उपलब्धता एवं अन्य अत्याधुनिक सुविधाओं से समृद्ध है। ये सुविधाएं छात्रों के समग्र विकास और पुनर्वास को सुनिश्चित करती हैं। विभाग असाधारण खेल कार्यक्रम की निरंतरता के साथ ही खेल भावना को तो बढ़ावा देता ही है, साथ ही यह गुणवत्तापूर्ण शिक्षा को बढ़ावा देकर समावेशी विकास को भी प्रोत्साहित

करता है। उच्च प्रदर्शन वाले एथलीटों के पोषण की प्रतिबद्धता के साथ, विभाग "सभी के लिए खेल" के अपने आदर्श के प्रति कटिबद्ध है।

Botanique, the Botanical Society of the Department of Botany, functioned actively during the academic session 2025–2026 with a strong emphasis on academic enrichment, environmental awareness, and global scientific perspectives. The society strives to bridge classroom learning with national and international developments in plant sciences, sustainability, and environmental policy. During the Orientation Programme for B.Sc. Botany, first year students were introduced to the NEP curriculum, departmental research culture, and interdisciplinary opportunities. Overall, seven academic events were successfully organized, out of which two were international.

A major highlight was the seminar organized in collaboration with SERNRM, featuring Dr. Balakrishna Pisupati, Head, UNEP India, which provided students with exposure to international environmental governance, restoration strategies, and global sustainability priorities. Prof. C. R. Babu, Professor Emeritus, University of Delhi, further enriched discussions on ecosystem restoration and ecosystem services.

Hands-on learning was promoted through a Mushroom Cultivation Workshop emphasizing sustainable biotechnology and entrepreneurship, while an IQAC-supported Laboratory Safety Workshop enhanced technical competence. On World Wetlands Day, a seminar on Wetlands for Sustainable Cities and an intercollegiate paper presentation competition encouraged research aligned with global conservation goals. In the forthcoming months, Botanique plans on publishing the sixth edition of Passiflora, the annual magazine, and initiate a podcast series featuring alumni, aimed at strengthening academic outreach, student engagement, and professional networking.

Technical engagement expanded through Encrypto '25, a multi-event techno-convergence that engaged 150+ participants. The event integrated an AI-driven case competition, the Battle of Lights Gaming Tournament, and an expert speaker session by industry experts, offering insights into AI evolution and future career pathways.

Academic depth and global collaboration were strengthened through the successful organization of the 5th International Conference on CICV, bringing together leading researchers, and scholars to exchange cutting-edge interdisciplinary research and engage in meaningful discourse. Complementing this, the launch of Bitwise 6, the annual magazine, alongside a Workshop on Quantum Computing, introduced participants to and next-generation computational paradigms. These efforts were reinforced through Cybersecurity Awareness Week with hands-on safety activities, and targeted Hansraj Information System and Samarth Portal Awareness Weeks, collectively enhancing cyber awareness, digital literacy, and institutional engagement.

The Hansraj Economics Society (EcoSoc) is a dynamic student-led body dedicated to fostering economic awareness and critical thinking. During the academic year 2025-26, the Society organized multiple captivating and insightful events.

A virtual Orientation Session welcomed first-year students, walking them through the society's vision and departmental opportunities through interactive icebreakers and a live Q&A. An Inaugural Alumni Meet brought together faculty, alumni, and current students for cultural performances, mentorship conversations, and an open-mic session that bridged generations and offered practical career guidance.

The society hosted several Speaker Sessions throughout the year. A seminar on careers in economics covered pathways into the Indian Economic Service, RBI, and SEBI, alongside guidance on research paper writing and profile building. DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

Pi: Department of Mathematics successfully organized three highly enriching academic sessions in 2025, aimed at guiding students in career development, research exposure, and understanding real-life applications of mathematics.

The first session, "Lakshya: The Career Talks" held on 25th September 2025, featured two distinguished speakers, Mr. Aman Nigam and Ms. Ila Jha, who provided valuable insights into MBA preparation and professional growth. Mr. Aman addressed the growing trend of misleading "fake MBA" content and explained the real value of an MBA in terms of networking, career switching, and professional recognition. Ms. Ila shared her inspiring journey from civil service aspirations to a corporate finance career, highlighting how a mathematics background strengthens analytical ability in MBA studies. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A.

The second session, "Pi Quest: A Journey to the Art of Research" conducted on 8th November 2025 via Google Meet, was led by Prof. Preeti Dharmarha, who introduced students to the meaning and importance of research. She explained how research develops creativity, problem-solving skills, and academic connections, while also discussing tools like LaTeX, BibTeX, Google Scholar, and Python.

The third talk, "From Viral Products to Volatile Markets: Three Flavours of Differential Equations" held on 24th November 2025, was delivered by Dr. Debasree Goswami, who explained how differential equations help model real-world phenomena like product diffusion and financial markets, including concepts like the Bass Model and Black-Scholes Model.

Overall, these sessions proved to be informative, motivating, and academically valuable for students.



DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

Rooted in India's rich intellectual heritage, the Department of Philosophy, through the Mimāṃsā Society, has strived to preserve, reinterpret, and enrich the Indian philosophical tradition while remaining connected to its classical roots.

In the year 2025–26, this vision was reflected in a series of academic initiatives, like "Dārśana Sangamah," which comprised thematic sessions conducted over two days, with the participation of resource persons of high academic standing. Prof. Ram Nath Jha, Prof. Sachchidanand Mishra, Prof. Rajneesh Shukla, Shri Prafulla Ketkar, Shri RVS Mani, Prof. Carlin Romano and others participated in various sessions and enriched listeners through their insights. Scholars from different philosophical traditions engaged in discussions on Vedic thought, Vedānta, epistemology, ethics, and contemporary philosophical concerns.

The Department organized a seminar on World Philosophy Day, on Vedantic Perspective of Philosophical Research. Dr. S. Paneerselvam, Prof. Girishwar Mishra, Prof. S. K. Maharana, and Prof. Laxmi Kant Padhi shared their insights on Vedānta as a living and practical philosophy.

A seminar on Ethics and Values in Ancient Indian Tradition addressed the relevance of ancient Indian ethical traditions in contemporary life. Dr. Nanditesh Nilay, the keynote speaker, examined the relationship between habits, virtues, values, and ethics, arguing that ethical living emerges organically from cultivated habits.

An International seminar was held where Prof. Purushottam Bilimoria shared his insights on Śabda Pramāna.

An online national webinar was held to examine yoga as an integral part of Indian knowledge Systems. Dr. K. Srinivasan and Prof. Jata Sankar delivered insightful lectures on yoga's philosophical foundations and its relevance for physical health, mental balance, ethical living, and spiritual growth.

Srishti Chetna, The Zoological Society, Hansraj College, conducted a series of events throughout the academic session 2025-2026. The academic year commenced with an inaugural lecture on "Mitochondria and Human Diseases", featuring Prof. RNK Bamezai, former VC of SMVDU, Katra and Padma Shri Awardee (Science and Engineering) by Govt. of India. The event was attended by more than 150 students, where Srishti Chetna society announced the student council for the session, followed by the engaging lecture delivered by the speaker on phylogeography, mitochondrial origin and human diseases. Also, the speaker encouraged the students to develop scientific a temperament by organizing such scientific events and discussions. Srishti Chetna, in collaboration with Haritima, jointly organised a "Quiz Competition- Delhi Safari" with fifteen teams, to engage students in an exploration of Delhi's ecological hotspots, biodiversity, and conservation challenges. Framed as a fun yet intellectually rigorous competition, the event tested participants' knowledge of urban flora and fauna, wetlands, and Delhi's protected areas.

The society also organized two more events in collaboration with other college societies. Firstly, an awareness programme in association with NSS, was organized on "Thalassemia", featuring Dr. Renu Singh and Prof. Sunita Jetly. The programme had an informative session covering causes, prevention, and management of thalassaemia. Secondly, Srishti Chetna in association with Transposon and Shakti initiated the Inaugural lecture as part of the national seminar series titled "Is AI the new language of Biology" in which Prof. Anurag Agrawal spoke about the transformative role of Artificial Intelligence in biosciences. Furthermore, "Nature cum Photography Walk" in association with Haritima was conducted to develop students' on ground skills and promote experiential learning. Finally, a skill enhancement workshop on "Vermiculture and Vermicomposting" in collaboration with Transposon, BSRC, and Haritima were conducted to reinforce the relevance of sustainable practices.



LIFE SCIENCES

Transposon – The Life Sciences Society of Hansraj College has continued to evolve as an intellectually vibrant platform fostering scientific temper, environmental responsibility, and interdisciplinary dialogue.

The Society's inaugural programme, "Voices of the Wild" (7th October 2025), organised during Wildlife Week, set the tone for the year's activities. The event featured expert talks by Ms. Upasana Ganguly on the ecological importance of wildlife corridors and Dr. Justin Mathew on the historical perspectives of urban wildlife. These academic deliberations were complemented by cultural expressions, including an Odissi dance performance and a theatrical skit portraying the conflict between human-driven development and wildlife conservation. The screening of the Academy Award-winning documentary *The Elephant Whisperers* sensitised students to grassroots conservation efforts.

Transposon co-hosted the speaker session "Is AI the New Language of Biology?" (31st October 2025) in collaboration with Srishti Chetna, where Prof. Anurag Agarwal emphasised the growing role of artificial intelligence in shaping contemporary biological research and data-driven discovery. The Society actively participated in the Delhi CSR Summit 2025 (15th November 2025), presenting a socially relevant skit titled "The Breath of Corruption," which highlighted the serious public health implications of the escalating Air Quality Index (AQI).

The society organized a Skill Enhancement Workshop on Vermiculture and Vermicomposting on 4th February 2026. The workshop introduced participants to the biological principles underlying vermiculture, the ecological role of earthworms, and the practical aspects of vermicompost production. The initiative encouraged students to view vermicomposting as both an environmental practice and a potential avenue for entrepreneurship and community outreach.

The Centre for Skill Development and Seri-technology (CSDS), Department of Zoology, Hansraj College, University of Delhi, aims to enhance employability, promote economic growth, and improve students' quality of life by imparting skill-based education where tradition meets innovation. The Centre focuses on the cultivation of food plants for silkworms, silk production, and silkworm egg production, empowering young individuals to initiate their own ventures. CSDS strongly emphasizes hands-on learning and regularly offers workshops, training programmes, and internships for students from institutions across India, along with specialized training for farmers. These programmes provide practical exposure for silkworm rearing, cocoon production, silk-based biomaterials, cosmetics, and device development etc. Through experiential learning, learners at CSDS actively produce mulberry and non-mulberry cocoons and develop a range of value-added products, demonstrating the Centre's commitment towards innovation and entrepreneurship. The Centre has received visits from NAAC peer team members and international delegates from the USA and the Republic of Korea, as well as scientists and faculty members from various institutions of India. CSDS aligns closely with national initiatives such as Skill India and Aatma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan, equipping youth with industry-relevant skills. By nurturing self-reliant entrepreneurs in high-potential sectors including textiles, agro-based cottage industries, cosmetics, biomedical sciences, and biotechnology, CSDS contribution proves significant.

INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM AND INNOVATION CENTRE

The Indian Knowledge System and Innovation Centre (IKSIC), Hansraj College, functioned actively throughout the academic year with the objective of promoting India's ancient knowledge traditions through a multidisciplinary and research-oriented approach.

The Centre received an Internship Scholarship sanctioned by IKS under the "Beyond Binary" project with Dr Deepak Kumar as PI. Following interviews, three student interns were selected. IKSIC organized several lectures and outreach programmes in online and offline modes. A lecture on Santhara/Sallekhana in Jain philosophy provided insights into the concept of spiritual death, clarified misconceptions equating it with suicide and euthanasia. Another session on "Ayurveda's Special: Body's Nature and Diet" in collaboration with Punarnava Nadi Rasayan Arogya Sansthan focused on body constitution (prakriti) and appropriate dietary practices, supported by live case studies. An Anugrah Bhashan by the Shankaracharya of Sringeri Sharada Peetham highlighted ethical and cultural values from the Ramayana, Mahabharata, and Vedas. The Centre also organized Bharat Bodh, an IKS National Competition, and collaborated with GITAM School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Visakhapatnam, and the Department of International Relations, Jadavpur University, Kolkata, for a two-day national seminar on "Embodied Justice: Memory, Violence and Resilience in India." The Centre remained committed to creating awareness of Indian knowledge systems alongside scientific and research-driven thinking.

The Centre's activities were meticulously planned and executed by the Coordinators, Dr. Deepak Kumar Sethy and Dr. Preeti Rani, along with the Convener.

In the first phase of the academic year 2025-26, the Entrepreneurial Cell of Hansraj College organised the National Incubation Summit on 10-11 October 2025, aimed at fostering startup growth and strengthening industry engagement. The summit featured ScaleUp Session curated for growing startups and student-led ventures in the scaling phase, focusing on expansion strategies, funding pathways, and market growth. A Panel Discussion with entrepreneurs and industry professionals provided insights into emerging startup trends, operational challenges, and innovation-driven business models. Additionally, a 1-on-1 Mentorship Programme offered personalised guidance to student founders, enabling them to refine business ideas, product strategies, and growth plans through structured mentor interactions.

To further strengthen industry-academia collaboration, the Entrepreneurial Cell, in collaboration with the Mahatma Hansraj Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (MHCIE), formalised a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Mr. Amit Jain, Co-Founder, Ashika Global Family Office Services. This partnership aims to facilitate mentorship, workshops, advisory support, and exposure to investment readiness and global market opportunities for student startups. Through these initiatives, the Cell contributed to nurturing a dynamic entrepreneurial ecosystem and empowering students with practical knowledge, strategic guidance, and industry exposure.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS SOCIETY (HARITIMA)

Haritima, the Environmental Awareness Society, successfully executed an array of initiatives in 2025-2026 to actively promote environmental stewardship through student-led initiatives. Haritima commenced the session on World Environment Day with "Green Walls," a vertical garden drive in collaboration with IIC and NSS that upcycled plastic bottles into planters. This was followed by a gamified "Plastic-Free Week" in July.

Intellectual engagement was prioritized through speaker sessions featuring Dr. Shafali Garg (Water Resource Management), Ms. Deepali Atul Deokar (Women in Conservation), and Mr. Ravi Kant (Sustainable Tourism). A strategic collaboration with TERI, titled "Pranada," further sensitized 115 students to Delhi's ecological challenges through technical sessions and film screenings. In October, the flagship "Wildlife Fiesta" fostered student creativity through multiple competitions, including "Eco Canvas" (quiz and poster-making with Srishti Chetna), "Archaic Archives" (creative writing), and a photography contest focused on human-animal coexistence.



FORMAL ENTITIES

P.N. BALI MUSHROOM CULTIVATION CENTRE

The P.N. Bali Mushroom Cultivation Centre, established under the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), was inaugurated at Hansraj College on May 4, 2023. The Centre aims to promote sustainable agriculture, student engagement, skill development, and community empowerment. Under the visionary leadership of Prof. Rama, Principal of Hansraj College, the Centre has evolved into a dynamic hub for hands-on learning and scientific innovation. The Centre focuses on enhancing employability, fostering economic growth, and strengthening students' practical skills. Students receive training in organic cultivation of button and oyster mushrooms, alongside workshops for both students and faculty on mushroom production techniques. During the academic session 2025-2026, 160 undergraduate students received hands-on training in mushroom cultivation, making a significant contribution to skill enhancement, research exposure, and sustainable agricultural practices.

The Women's Development Cell (WDC) of Hansraj College is committed to fostering an inclusive and empowering environment where awareness transforms into action. Throughout the year, the cell has worked consistently towards promoting women's health, safety, rights, and holistic well-being.

The year started with the speaker session on the new guidelines on POSH by the University of Delhi. The session was delivered by Dr. Shivani Verma. A key initiative, Swasth Nari Shashaktikaran Abhiyan - Healthy Women, Empowered Mission, focused on health awareness, mental wellness, public health discussions, and Basic Life Support training. The Donna Saheli Pad Distribution Drive extended menstrual hygiene awareness and essential support to communities at Nayi Basti, reinforcing dignity at the grassroots level. Through the Cyber Shield Project, organized in collaboration with the Naksh Foundation, students were sensitized about cyber safety and digital responsibility. In addition, WDC conducted mental health related session to encourage open dialogue and emotional well-being among students.

Alongside these initiatives, WDC runs impactful series such as 'Myth & Misconception,' where common myths surrounding women are addressed weekly to promote informed understanding. 'Know Your Rights' educates students about legal protections and entitlements, fostering awareness and confidence. 'Astitva' delves into the multifaceted realities of women's lives celebrating achievements while acknowledging invisible struggles and societal barriers.

Through dialogue, outreach, and continuous engagement, WDC strives to create a space where empowerment is not just discussed, but lived.

BSRC-THE BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES RESEARCH CELL

Since its inception in March 2025, the Biological Sciences Research Cell (BSRC) at Hansraj College has been committed to promoting scientific excellence and interdisciplinary research among students. In 2025–26, BSRC organised a wide range of academic programs, workshops, and awareness initiatives to enhance research skills, scientific literacy, and community engagement.

The inaugural workshop on Reptiles of India enabled 107 participants to gain practical insights into snake identification, urban challenges, myths, and safe rescue techniques. A microplastics awareness campaign engaged around 100 participants through posters and slogan-writing competition, highlighting environmental and health impacts, with awards for the best slogans. An online microphotography competition received 31 national and several international entries, showcasing microscopic biological structures.

BSRC conducted Alumni Interaction Sessions, provided students guidance on research careers and higher studies in India and abroad. A hands-on *C. elegans* workshop, led by Dr. Arnab Mukhopadhyay (National Institute of Immunology), attracted participants from Hansraj College, University of Delhi, and other institutions. The Second Alumni Interaction Session was hosted to provide guidance in higher studies, research opportunities, and career pathways in science. A Scientific writing workshop by an expert from All India Institute of Medical Sciences trained 128 students in manuscript preparation, ethics, and peer review, followed by a Vermiculture and Vermicomposting workshop in collaboration with Transposon, Sristhi Chetna, and Haritima to enhance research skills, sustainability awareness, and community engagement. Through these initiatives, BSRC continues to strengthen research readiness, interdisciplinary engagement, and sustainable practices among the student community.

CENTRE FOR VEDIC AND YOGIC SCIENCES (CVYS)

The Centre for Vedic and Yogic Sciences (CVYS) at Hansraj College is dedicated to advancing integrative research, education, and experiential learning rooted in India's Vedic and Yogic heritage. Anchored in the intellectual depth of Sanskrit texts, philosophical traditions, and Yogic knowledge systems, the Centre fosters a meaningful dialogue between ancient metaphysical thought and contemporary scientific paradigms. CVYS promotes interdisciplinary inquiry that connects consciousness studies, ethics, wellness, cosmology, and Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) with modern academic frameworks.

During the academic year 2025–26, CVYS organized a series of impactful academic, spiritual, and experiential programmes that blended Vedic wisdom with modern inquiry. The Centre actively strengthened national collaborations with leading institutions including the Inter-University Centre for Yogic Sciences (IUCYS), Bengaluru; Inter University Accelerator Centre (IUAC), New Delhi; Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU); IIT Roorkee; Dr. Hari Singh Gour Central University, Sagar (M.P.); and Central Sanskrit University, Delhi. International academic engagement was fostered through collaborations with Kingston College, London; the GSI Helmholtz Centre for Heavy Ion Research, Germany; and other European and Asian universities working in science–spirituality research.

CVYS offered an Add-on Certificate Course, "Indian Knowledge System for Creating a Global Well-being Curriculum" (SWAYAM Portal), attended by 30 students, and plans upcoming courses such as Research Ethics. Major events included a Faculty Development Programme on Vedic Sciences, national seminars on Vedic cosmology and philosophy, and a spiritual discourse (Anugrah Bhāsan) by the Jagadguru Shankaracharya of Sringeri, attended by over 250 participants. Students are also actively engaged in manuscript studies of ancient scripts such as Brāhmī, Śāradā, Grantha, and Old Nāgarī, strengthening India's civilizational knowledge continuity.




