Haritima, the Environmental Awareness Society of Hans Raj College in association with Millennium India Education Foundation celebrated the "World Ozone Day" with great zeal and enthusiasm.

The interactive session with the students was addressed by the very special, experienced, multi-talented and adorable Chief Guest, Professor Maharaj K. Pandit. Prof. Maharaj K. Pandit is a Radcliffe fellow from Harvard University, Dean at faculty of Science, University of Delhi, Professor and Head at Department of Environmental Studies and Director at the Centre for Interdisciplinary Studies of Mountain and Hill Environment.

The beginning of the event was done by lighting the lamp and invoking the blessings of Almighty. Carrying the function forward, a Power Point Presentation was explained thoroughly regarding the ozone layer and its depletion by Ashmita, a student of Botany (Honours), 3<sup>rd</sup> year of Hans Raj College. She presented the minutest details regarding the International Day for the preservation of ozone layer.

Prof. Maharaj K. Pandit himself presented a Power point presentation regarding his book "Life in The Himalayas" published by Harvard University press showing the concern towards the environment and causes responsible for the degradation. He outlined the mountains past in order to map a way towards a sustainable future.

Followed by, students took the pledge to reduce the consumption of ozone depleting substances (ODS) which includes air conditioners, refrigerators, fire extinguishers, aerosols, sprays and deodorants. Instead, the suggestion was given to increase the use of Hydrocarbons in place of Chlorofluorocarbons.
