Powerplay

Powerplay is one of the most competed in events. With 250+ registrations and a tagline stating "Ace the inning to trace your winning" participants were given a platform where they unshackled their knowledge of cricket in the economics-themed cricket face-off. It was an interactive event that was held in the college itself. The event comprised various challenging rounds of the cricket world which allowed participants to play on the front foot and test their cricket acumen against their fortunes. The winners were awarded cash prizes and amazing gifts. The event was well appreciated by all the participants

Policypher

The Economics Department of Hansraj College successfully organized Policypher, a case study competition calling the participants to "Awaken your inner Sherlock to crack this case!". It was a unique opportunity for the candidates to showcase their analytical and problem-solving skills. The competition was held in two phases- the prelims (held online), and then the finals, in the college. The finals witness 10 teams who were shortlisted after the preliminary round. The teams were provided case studies based on economic schools of thought and had to solve the dilemmas of their respective economies based on the identified school. The event was judged by Ms. Madhavi Moni and Mr. Animesh Naskar. The judges carefully monitored the case study PowerPoint presentations and gave their valuable feedback. The participants were influenced by the rich experience and guidance of the esteemed panel of judges.

Samwaad

"Samwaad- Dialogue, Deliberation and Discussion" allowed participants to step in the shoes of global policymakers, enabling them to devise a proposal for landing at a negotiation, agreed upon by all the teams and judges. Participants had to not only prove their stance but also come up with reasonable and viable policies to put those plans into action. Speaking skills, convincing power, farsightedness, and the ability to think and make decisions during a crisis were all tested simultaneously. The event had three rounds of eliminatory fashion. Two teams would face against each other, and the winner moved up to the next round until the final victor emerged.

Fables of Fraud

"Catch the glitch, find the snitch"- each year Inceptum features a new event that has never been played before. This year too, participants were offered a chance to actually apply the economics from their books and use it to catch the fraudulent activity. With 200+ registrations, the event took place in the form of a puzzle with plot twists and mind games. The students had to use the clues being revealed by the team in order to uncover the sham.
