Experts like Divya Dureja, Jigyasa Tandon, Sanjukta Basu, and Shristhi sensitised audience in such a way about these topics that made the discussion even better and interesting. At the end a drag performer, Prateek Sachdeva displayed his art beautifully, giving a message of be who you are and breaking free from stereotypes that bind us.
