1. Hansraj College Information System The Hansraj Information System					

1. Hansraj College Information System The Hansraj Information System serves as a platform designed to gather, manage, and safeguard the records of both faculty members and students at Hansraj. To enhance its capabilities and address challenges in organising students' progress and placement data, there was a subsequent plan to compile comprehensive details of all activities undertaken by our students

post-enrollment at HRC. This encompassed their involvement in diverse academic and extracurricular pursuits, accomplishments, supplementary courses, completed projects, research endeavours, internships, and placement records. To construct this system, a thorough requirement analysis was conducted, and the necessary fields were meticulously finalized. This process was harmonized with the Mentorship program, leading to backend work focused on creating the web-based module for student access, thus forming the student portal. Students can input information about their internships, additional courses, extracurricular engagements, progress, and placement status through this portal. The system significantly enriches the compilation of student data, particularly concerning their advancement and placement. Assigned teachers actively oversee the student portal in the role of Guardians/Mentors, providing guidance to students, encouraging their active participation, and aiding in resolving any issues related to the web-based modules.

2. Promoting inter-disciplinary research -To foster interdisciplinary research initiatives, Hansraj College has implemented several avenues such as Research Journals, Research grants, and Research Excellence awards. The college's research journals, namely HansShodhSudha and the recently launched HRC Journal of Economics and Finance, serve as platforms for undergraduate students, research scholars, and faculty to disseminate their scholarly findings. The latter journal specifically invites research papers and articles focusing on economics, business, and management for its quarterly publication and has been assigned the ISSN Number 2583-8814. In a bid to encourage interdisciplinary research and innovation among faculty and students, the college advertised invitations for research proposals throughout the year. These proposals aimed to stimulate collaborative efforts among faculty members from diverse departments or individual faculty contributions towards interdisciplinary research projects. Additionally, the Research Development Cell introduced the Research Excellence Awards during Foundation Day 2023. These prestigious awards recognize individuals who have made outstanding research contributions or conducted noteworthy research activities that significantly benefit the College community.

3. Student Learning Centre - The Student Learning Center at our institution is dedicated to fostering the holistic development of our students, both personally and intellectually, by encouraging interdisciplinary learning and addressing academic gaps. An orientation program was conducted on February 21st, 2023, aimed at introducing first-year students to the offerings of the Student Learning Centre. One of the center's key initiatives, the Peer-Peer Mentoring Program, is designed to enhance teaching and learning experiences for undergraduates across various disciplines. This program facilitates personalized one-to-one connections between student mentors and mentees, focusing on nurturing critical thinking, fostering reasoning skills, promoting teamwork, and enriching the cognitive abilities of participating students. Peer-topeer mentoring sessions were continued across multiple departments to ensure its ongoing effectiveness. Moreover, as part of the Peerto-Peer mentoring initiative, a practical workshop titled "Formulation of Herbal Soaps" was conducted on January 24th, 2023. This hands-on workshop provided students with practical learning experiences under the guidance of their peers within the mentoring framework.

4. Academic and Administrative auditing Regular academic and administrative audits are part of our institution's governance and quality assurance measures. In October 2022, an internal audit was conducted for the last academic session, while an external academic audit spanning the last five academic years took place in the second week of November 2022. These audits play a crucial role in ensuring the effectiveness and efficiency of the teaching-learning processes within all departments. Furthermore, an administrative audit was carried out on November 21st, 2022, focusing on evaluating administrative functions and processes within the institution. These audits are essential to maintaining and enhancing the overall operational efficiency and quality of academic and administrative functions.

5. Promotion of faculty members Faculty promotions at our institution adhere strictly to the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) set forth by the University. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been consistently engaged in facilitating faculty promotions, ensuring transparency throughout the process in alignment with the University's SOPs. Recently, based on recommendations from the selection committee, the governing body approved the promotion of seven Associate Professors to the rank of Professor. These promotions were granted under the Career Advancement Scheme - 2018/2010, demonstrating our commitment to recognizing and advancing the careers of deserving faculty members in accordance with the stipulated guidelines.

15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary			
Hansraj College is steadfast in its commitment to advancing the principles outlined in the National Education Policy 2020, aimed at providing exemplary education that fosters the comprehensive growth of students, cultivating a global perspective. Several events including FDPs and seminars are conducted regularly. These programs			

focused on deliberating key principles such as curriculum and pedagogical diversity, integration of cutting-edge technology and inventive teaching methodologies, promotion of creativity and critical thinking, and the encouragement of rational decision-making and innovation.

In recent years, Hansraj College has spearheaded several initiatives to nurture a thriving academic milieu. These initiatives encompass the development of interdisciplinary collaborative programs, specialised lectures, seminars, workshops on value addition courses and skill enhancement courses, symposia, field trips, and interdisciplinary courses offered across various departments. The college is poised to diligently implement the University of Delhi's Undergraduate Curriculum Framework-2022 (UGCF), aligned with the New Education Policy 2020, commencing from the academic Session (2022-23). This implementation will be conducted with meticulous monitoring to ensure the optimal fulfilment of students' needs.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The UGCF 2022 aligns with a curriculum framework designed for the accrual and utilization of credits within the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). This framework offers students the flexibility to utilize earned credits towards attaining Certificates, Diplomas, or

Degrees, fostering opportunities for lifelong learning. It facilitates students in accessing academic resources beyond their primary study program, either nationally or internationally, contingent upon their preferences. As a prominent constituent college within the University of Delhi, Hansraj College is poised to formally integrate the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) once it becomes accessible through the University.

17.Skill development:

Hansraj College meticulously designs targeted programs to bolster skill development, showcasing initiatives like add-on courses, tailored Remedial classes in English for SC/ST/OBC students and specialised Hindi classes tailored for students from the Northeast.

Student Learning Centre (SLC) of Hansraj College focuses on augmenting academic learning beyond the classroom curriculum. It offers programmes and short-term courses to enhance interdisciplinary learning and boost technological skills. It seeks to curate well-structured programmes and opportunities for students to further their knowledge and research capabilities besides training them in professional skills. The centre offers short-term courses that contribute to enhanced employability and cater to the evolving needs of the students. Courses like Machine Learning, Cyber Security and Ethical Hacking, Future Skills for Employability and Innovation, IPR, Start-up and Entrepreneurship have been widely appreciated.

Additionally, classroom teaching incorporates software programs like Tally, Stata, R, Mathematica, Sci-Lab, LaTeX, and other open-source software to enhance the accounting and quantitative skills of the students. Guided tours to institutions like the National StockExchange to buttress the pedagogy of theoretical knowledge are also conducted

Faculty members consistently mentor and empower students to embark on independent research endeavours, bridging the gap between theoretical concepts and real-world applications.

The college boasts diverse vibrant co-curricular societies such as Swaranjali, Dramatics Society, and Debating Society, fostering skill enrichment across various domains. The Women Development Cell collaborates with the Delhi Police to conduct self-defence training programs for female students. Since 2021, Hansraj College has actively engaged in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), a flagship initiative by the Ministry of Education, aimed at acquainting

faculty and students with the rural landscape's realities.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Hansraj College actively promotes the study and exploration of national languages like Hindi and Sanskrit, offering undergraduate degree programs in these languages. The college's library houses an extensive collection of around five thousand books in Sanskrit and Urdu, primarily focusing on Vedas and Upanishads, highlighting the institution's commitment to linguistic scholarship. To further fortify linguistic research, the Mahatma Hansraj Research Center (MHRC) in Linguistics was established, catering specifically to the departments of Hindi and Sanskrit. This centre provides a wellequipped language laboratory featuring language-related fonts, software, and facilities tailored for translation and transliteration purposes.

In alignment with the principles of Mahatma Hansraj and the DAV philosophy, Hansraj College established the Vishva Bandhu Centre of Vedic Research. This centre has undertaken significant initiatives such as developing a Vedic Lexicon and publishing alphabetical indices to the Padapathas of Rigveda, Yajurveda, Samveda, and Atharvaveda. Apart from academic pursuits, the Vishwa Bandhu Centre for Vedic Research organizes yoga camps, fostering spiritual growth among students and faculty while promoting a disciplined approach to health and wellness. The centre provides dedicated spaces for yoga and meditation, contributing to recreational activities and occasional events. Moreover, specialized yoga classes are conducted separately for male and female students. These initiatives are strategically designed to align with and support the implementation of the New Education Policy (NEP).

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Hansraj College, affiliated with the University of Delhi, rigorously adheres to the university's well-structured curriculum. The academic programs are meticulously designed based on outcomes-based education (OBE) principles, and meticulously tailored to address local and global educational needs. Each course's learning outcomes are intricately woven into the prescribed syllabi, serving as fundamental guidelines that shape teaching, learning, and assessment methods.

Faculty members actively oversee the progression of courses, ensuring they stay aligned with the defined objectives and milestones. The college maintains a proactive stance by consistently updating its website with relevant notifications, circulars, and revisions provided by the University. This dedicated effort contributes to the smooth implementation of the curriculum and enriches the overall educational journey for students.

20.Distance education/online education:

During the COVID-19 pandemic, academic institutions utilised various digital platforms to engage with students and conduct classes, conferences, events and meetings. This shift has come with its own set of issues and challenges. Keeping aside the negative impact of lack of face-to-face learning, the online teaching-learning process has broken the geographical barriers creating interaction between experts and students from distant geographies. The rapid shift in educational needs has paved the way for adopting the hybrid education mode even after the lockdown. Mahatma Hansraj Faculty Development Centre (MHRFDC) launched the e-Samvaad Centre where we have our in-house studio room with all the modern and state-of-theart facilities to facilitate the recording of digital content. e-Samvaad Centre, MHRFDC, Hansraj College contributes towards the creation of digital content from faculty members, and professionals in the form of video lectures in the area of their expertise or any other contemporary topic of general interest to all. Faculty members of the college regularly contribute to digital content creation. This can be considered the new normal, which is envisaged in the New Education Policy as well.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Hansraj College follows a cohesive and well-organized pedagogic approach that aligns with the comprehensive framework, timelines, and predetermined syllabus set by Delhi University. The planning for each semester initiates well in advance, with the college academic calendar, teacher, and student timetables established before the commencement of each semester. The timetable and workload committees collaborate with individual departments to formulate schedules for both teachers and students.

To accommodate student preferences, the college solicits options ahead of the semester, allowing departments to adequately prepare, especially for elective offerings. Workload calculations are meticulously conducted, and faculty recruitment is carried out according to the identified needs. In an effort to enhance curriculum delivery efficiency, faculty members are required to develop modular teaching plans prior to the semester, which are then shared with the IQAC for review.

In line with the pedagogic approach, Hansraj College implements a robust tutorial and mentorship program. Additionally, regular Research and Faculty Development Programs are organized for teachers to stay abreast of the latest knowledge and methodologies. Teachers actively participate in various University bodies, contributing to curriculum reviews, assessment, and evaluation. The continuous improvement of curriculum delivery is ensured through periodic reviews during department meetings, allowing for mid-course corrections if deemed necessary.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

As a constituent college of Delhi University, we adhere to the

University's prescribed procedures concerning the academic calendar and internal assessment of students. The internal assessment grades, when combined with the semester end examination grades, contribute to the calculation of consolidated semester grades. Nevertheless, our ongoing commitment is to foster a culture among teachers that promotes continuous evaluation in various forms.

Implementing a system of continuous internal evaluation functions as an alert mechanism, notifying students of areas where corrective action may be needed. This ongoing evaluation can include class tests, quizzes, and active participation in class discussions, facilitating the consolidation of concepts learned in class. Students are provided with advance notice of assessment dates, and if a student has legitimate reasons for missing an assessment, teachers are open to conducting assessments for that student at a later date.

All internal assessment marks are regularly communicated to students, and teachers go the extra mile to support weaker students, assisting them in improving both grades and overall understanding. Furthermore, teachers collaborate with department heads, sharing modular plans to coordinate teaching schedules and ensure the timely completion of courses.

Gender-related issues find dedicated attention through societies such as the Women Development Cell, Gender Equality Cell, and Girl Up, all committed to challenging societal issues like patriarchy, sexism, homophobia, and prejudice, while enhancing women's empowerment. 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Assessing students' learning levels is an ongoing procedure that incorporates both formal and informal methods. Formally, we utilize regular assignments and tutorials to identify learning gaps, which are subsequently addressed in lectures and future tutorial sessions. Informally, we rely on our college's mentoring system to assess these gaps. Through the mentoring sessions, mentors gather feedback on the extent of these gaps and convey them to the relevant teachers for corrective action. Because students' learning experiences vary, it is crucial to identify slow learners and tailor strategies to meet their needs differently from those of advanced learners.

It has come to our attention that slow learning frequently emerges from the fact that the primary language of instruction is English. To tackle this issue, we are taking steps to provide English language and communication courses through the Student Learning Center. Additionally, we are also promoting the idea of teachers being bilingual to the extent required and feasible. Through our peer mentoring and tutoring program, proficient learners volunteer to assist their peers who may be struggling, thereby mutually benefiting from the experience.

Advanced learners are motivated to engage in research, co-author papers, and are connected to alumni for research assistant roles and internships.

The central goal of the teaching and learning process is to equip students with the skills necessary to become life-long learners. One effective approach is to teach them problem-solving strategies, enabling them to think creatively, critically, and make informed decisions. Since problem-solving is context-dependent and cannot be taught in isolation, our teachers use discipline-specific examples and real-world applications to cultivate these abilities. Participatory learning is encouraged through educational trips and presentation-based assessments whenever feasible. Additionally, discipline-specific methods include extension lectures and invited talks by experts that expose students to the forefront of their field. Each department hosts its own society, engaging in activities that make learning enjoyable through multifarious activities. Add-on courses are regularly offered to the students for augmented learning.

Additionally, a dynamic network of student-led societies provides opportunities for students to explore their potential and develop competencies that give them a competitive advantage. We offer more than 60 societies focusing on various areas such as consulting, entrepreneurship, environment awareness, culinary arts, photography and media, among others. Students also engage in social entrepreneurship through initiatives like Enactus, a social entrepreneurship program by KPMG. The student-led placement cell is another crucial society that connects members with the corporate world.

With a Wi-Fi enabled campus, a fully digital rich library and modern labs with latest teaching and research software and smart-board classrooms, the college makes every possible effort to equip the teachers and the students with contemporary tools in order to produce perpetual learners. ICT enriched environment is more conducive for learners in terms of making use of technologies and enables them to perceive and elucidate information, and become more reflective and critical about information quality and sources. The internal assessment component of Delhi University's Examination System allows for flexibility in how evaluations are conducted and the methods employed for assessment. The continuous internal assessment approach aims to ensure that students receive regular feedback on their progress, enabling them to pinpoint areas where they need to improve. We employ various assessment tools, including multiple-choice questions, comprehensive written responses, presentations, projects, quizzes, and more, all aimed at effectively measuring the course's outcomes.

To guarantee transparency and robustness, the internal assessment modes and tentative dates are thoughtfully planned in advance for each paper by the respective teacher(s). These details are integrated into the academic modular plans created at the start of each semester. The weightage assigned to each activity for internal assessment is clearly communicated to the students at the beginning of each course. We also provide multiple opportunities for students to enhance their performance.

Furthermore, our instructors are instructed to reach out to students who, for any reason, have not participated in the internal assessment, using methods such as email and collaborating with the students' mentors if necessary. This proactive approach ensures that the internal assessment process remains equitable and fair for all students.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

Adhering to the prescribed system of evaluation by the University of Delhi, Hansraj College follows the continuous internal assessment mechanism wherein students are assessed comprehensively via periodic tests, assignments, group projects, presentations etc.

Once the internal assessment is collated at the end of the semester, the score charts are shared with the students by the concerned teachers. The related discrepancies or grievances are brought to the notice of the teachers and are addressed by them. Multiple opportunities are provided to the students to improve their performance. Departments are instructed to contact students who have not appeared for internal assessment for whatsoever reason through mail and/or other modes.

A two-tier moderation of assessment is done before the assessment is submitted to the university. Each department has a department moderation committee composed of the current Teacher in charge, the previous Teacher in charge and the senior most department member. After the department-level moderation, it is placed in the purview of the college Moderation Committee.

If despite the rigor of the above mechanism. an error is reported by a student or faculty, it is conveyed to the university via the Internal Assessment Rectification Request Facility of the University of Delhi.

Our evaluation system adheres to the University of Delhi's guidelines, with 75% of the assessment attributed to the university's end-semester exams, and 25% to internal assessments by instructors. In our new (partially implemented as of now) curriculum aligned with the National Education Policy, 90 out of 160 marks are allocated to the university's end-semester exams, with the remaining 70 marks based on continuous internal assessment. Various assessment methods, including assignments, multiple-choice questions, and quizzes, are employed to gauge course outcomes effectively. Our commitment to achieving outcomes is validated by the success of our graduates. Our placement and internship cells work diligently to secure job opportunities and internships for students, providing a tangible measure of our success. Furthermore, our entrepreneurial cell fosters the growth of self-employed individuals with innovative startups, contributing significantly to our outcomes.

Many students pursue further studies, both domestically and abroad, with faculty recommendations, serving as an ongoing metric of success. Finally, our alumni association maintains strong connections with former students who return to share knowledge and life experiences, highlighting our ongoing commitment to achieving our goals year after year.

3.2 - Innovation Ecosystem

3.2.1 - Institution has created an ecosystem for innovations and has initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

To comply with the mission of Atma-Nirbhar Bharat as mandated by the Government of India, Hansraj College has established Research and Development Cell (RDC), Institutional Innovation Council (IIC), and Mahatma Hansraj Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (MHCIIE) to provide infrastructural and operational support.

i) Under RDC, our research centres - Har Gobind Khorana Centre for Chemical Biology (HC2B) and Jagadish Chandra Bose Centre for Plant Genomics (JCBCPG); sericulture and mushroom culture facilities; central instrumentation facility (CIF); Panchbhoot, an interdisciplinary environment research center, and a biotech R&D start-up company HeteroChem InnoTech (HeCIT) provide infrastructural support for research and skill enhancement. RDC continued with 17sanctioned interdisciplinary research projects that involve around 36faculty members and 25undergraduate students.

ii) IIC conducted many workshops, seminars, awareness programs on academic integrity and IPRs, Hackathons, idea competitions, and minichallenges with the involvement of industry experts to brainstorm innovative ideas.

iii) MHCIIE has facilitated start-ups by providing quality and affordable incubation services and mentorship by illustrious industry experts on their board.

The impact of these initiatives can be seen in the form of 220 research publications, 112 books/chapters/conference proceedings, total grants worth Rupees 93.29 Lakhs and 18 faculty recognized as Ph.D. supervisors.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college boasts an impressive infrastructure and state-of-the-art facilities dedicated to enhancing the teaching and learning experience. These encompass well-appointed classrooms, laboratories, cutting-edge computing equipment, a cafeteria, and a medical room, all within a Wi-Fi-enabled campus. Many classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors to facilitate modern teaching methodologies.

In addition to regular classrooms, the college features two seminar rooms that serve as venues for lectures, seminars, conferences, workshops, FDPs, online examinations, placement tests, and more. The E-Samvaad Centre offers a specialized facility for recording lectures, adding a dynamic dimension to the learning environment. An ultra-modern, air-conditioned auditorium provides a sophisticated venue for various events.

The college is equipped withan air-conditioned library that utilizes RFID technology and KOHA software, catering to the needs of both students and teachers. The library includes separate study rooms for faculty and students, with accommodations for differently-abled individuals. Common staff rooms with locker facilities are available for the teachers, complementing individual departmental faculty rooms. The college further offers an Enabling Unit Room, equipped with audio aids and computer facilities. To ensure accessibility, the college features ramps, a foot-over bridge connecting different blocks, a tactile path, and three lifts strategically placed for the convenience of differently-abled students. A dedicated hostel accommodates approximately 200 undergraduate male and 30 female students.

It provides a dedicated Braille Library from the University of Delhi and facilitates accessibility through a KIBO Scanner in the enabling unit. The college ensures a comprehensive examination of its financial affairs through both internal and statutory audits, adhering to the stipulations outlined by the University of Delhi and UGC. Internally, meticulous scrutiny of the college's expenditures is executed through the DAV Internal audit mechanism, ensuring transparency and accountability in financial transactions.

Externally, the Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) conducts periodic audits every five years. As of the latest audit cycle in 2021-22, any objections raised during the CAG audit are addressed through collaborative efforts between the Accounts Office and the Finance Committee of the college. The annual statutory audit, encompassing elements such as staff salaries, fee collection, UGC grants, and the income generated from self-financed courses, is conducted by a Chartered Accountant. This process ensures compliance with regulatory standards and best financial practices.

Moreover, the college maintains a rigorous auditing system for scholarships, with the statement of account subject to regular examination and oversight by the college accountant. This commitment to financial accountability underlines the college's dedication to maintaining the highest standards in its fiscal operations.

IQAC, Hansraj College has been instrumental in conceiving, organizing, and managing a range of initiatives to enhance and enrich the institution's research, innovation, social and environmental issues, and teaching and learning processes during the year.

IQAC has played a crucial role in the successful implementation of NEP 2020 from the academic session 2022-23 with the introduction of a four-year undergraduate programme aligned with the University of Delhi.

The Mahatma Hansraj Faculty Development Centre (FDC) has organized several Faculty development programmes (FDPs), international programmes, and seminars/workshops emphasising quality assurance and interdisciplinary approach under Pandit MadanMohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT). Several skill enhancement programmes were conducted especially for non-teaching staff.

The Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) of IQAC organized programs for innovation and entrepreneurship, intellectual property rights awareness, and impact lectures under the Ministry of Education (MoE), Govt. of India. Research Development Cell initiated the Mahatma Excellence Award for students and Faculty for their exemplary research contributions/activities to the College. They also advertisedfunding to different faculty members for pursuing interdisciplinary research.

6.5.2 - The institution reviews its teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals through IQAC set up as per norms and recorded the incremental improvement in various activities

The IQAC has constituted sub-committees including the Academic and Administrative Audit Committee, Information System Cell, Student Learning Centre, and Feedback Analysis Team for achieving effective teaching-learning processes and administrative functioning.

An academic audit committee conducted regular analyses of academic progress and ensured the briefing of detailed academic calendars in all departments. Additionally, external academic auditing was also organised for all departments to assess the academic progress with respect to teaching modular plans, academic calendar, research activities and student progression for the last five years. An administrative audit aims to develop and assess the institutes' policies, strategies, operations, and functions. An internal administrative audit was conducted on 21st November 2022.

Within a mentorship program, a wider perspective was included and a very efficient Hansraj Information System was constituted where students can make entry of their progress in the portal on a regular basis. The student learning centre (SLC) of IQAC continues its popular peer-to-peer mentoring program in which students learn from and with each other. Group study sessions of peer-to-peer mentoring become a source of encouragement and motivation for the students making them better team players. The SLC also organised workshops under the canopy of peer-to-peer mentoring where hands-on training was given to students by the students.

The feedback analysis team regularly obtains feedback from students, parents, and alumni on teaching-learning processes and resources provided and complies requisite action taken report. Additionally, students benefit from internship cells, placement cells, societies, community college ventures, and capacity-building & skills enhancement initiatives of the college.

e. TED talks, Lectures series hosted and delivered by women, LGBT community and offers some scholarships especially for girl students.

f. Girls hostel facility has been started in the college.

The college has consistently received accolades at IIT Delhi on World Environment Day for its efforts in raising awareness about diverse environmental issues. Notably, it was honoured by The Swami Vivekananda Foundation for its impactful Green Activities. The thriving gardens and lawns attract a variety of fauna, enriching the college environment with vibrancy and vitality.

Efforts to manage garden waste include on-site composting through two distinct setups: Vermicomposting, managed by the Department of Zoology, and Garden Composting overseen by the Garden Committee, ensuring the conversion of waste into valuable organic manure. The college has established a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Delhi DEEPC and Blue Planet, a reputed international organization. Collaborating with the NGO Ecoprabandhan associated with the New Delhi Municipal Corporation, plastic bottles were ingeniously transformed into benches that now grace the college campus.

Efficient handling of paper waste involves collecting it in designated recycling rooms, which is then picked up by "JAAGRUTI," a reputable NGO.

E-Waste Collection Bin are placed to ensure collection and recycling is regulated. The faculty's active involvement in delivering talks, contributing articles, and engaging in research initiatives serves as a significant contribution toward promoting interventions across various levels of sustainability.
