C-1	Classical Sanskrit Literature (Poetry) (12131101)
CO1:	Understand the general outlines of Classical Sanskrit Literature (Poetry) through classical texts.

C-2	Critical Survey of Sanskrit Literature (12131102)

CO3:	Students will understand the Indian Knowledge tradition and its impact on the Society.
